Educational items for students to own

Attached is a list of items that the school recommends you purchase from Maxim for your child to individually own and use.

Maxim Stationery company have a Parent Payment Portal so you can log in to their website, find our school and child's 2023-year level (Grade 1) and the book pack is available to order. To save on shipping costs for our families, we have organised a bulk delivery directly to school for Tuesday 6th December.

Your child's pack will be available to collect in the last 2 weeks of Term 4. We will set up a collection day and time and advise closer to the date once delivery has arrived. You can collect the pack and take it home to label, ready for the start of school in 2023.

You are welcome to choose an alternative supplier, just ensure you order the correct items. Especially the Exercise books as certain year levels require specific sizes for handwriting. You will notice some items are not on the Maxim portal but still required.

Maxim will be live for D.C.P.S orders from Monday 10th October until Tuesday 8th November to ensure free delivery to school this year.

After this date you can still purchase the items from Maxim, you will just have to collect your pack on Jan 27th from the school office, or you can choose home delivery for a small fee through Maxim. If you choose delivery, it will be up to you to track and liaise with Maxim.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
